POLICY DOCUMENT ON WASTE MANAGEMENT

Khejuri College has put into place a comprehensive policy on Waste Management. It has been realised that effective waste management and adoption of sustainable practices are of utmost necessity in upholding ecological preservation and maintaining an eco-friendly ambience in campus. The College strives to realise sustainable and holistic waste management essential for reducing carbon foot print and for providing a safe and healthy work environment for teaching and non-teaching staff, students, visitors and other stakeholders.

Objectives:

- To segregate waste material as biodegradable, non-biodegradable, liquid, bio-medical and e-waste.
- To raise awareness among students and staff about proper waste management practices.
- To collaborate with local authorities in proper management of waste.
- To reduce carbon foot print and hence uphold an eco-friendly ambience in the campus.

Policies:

All students and staff of Khejuri College are disciplined to practise waste disposal in dustbins as separately labelled according to category of waste.

1. **Solid Waste:** The College has arrangement with the local “Baratala Gram Panchayat” for the collection and disposal of ‘Solid waste’ that are generated in the campus. The wastes are segregated in different marked and covered Bins installed in different points of the campus. Biodegradable waste is collected in Green Bins while non-biodegradable waste is collected in Blue Bins. The Baratala Gram Panchayat sends ‘Garbage Van’ to the campus and collect non-Biodegradable wastes that are preserved in the covered Bins. Biodegradable waste is disposed in Vermicompost pit.
2. **Liquid Waste:** Sanitary as well as lab waste are collected in a pit & discharged to outside via drain maintained by Panchayat.
3. **E-Waste:** E-waste is collected in Black coloured bin. Negotiation with “ Baratala Gram Panchayat is going on for collection & disposal.
4. **Sanitary waste:** Sanitary waste like sanitary napkins disposed through incinerator at the campus.
5. **Bio-medical Waste:** Department of Zoology and Department Aquaculture Management performs some practical activities like blood group determination, Hb test, mitochondrial stain, blood pressure determination, salivary amylase test, dissection of cockroach for nervous system and mouth part etc. Needle, slide, cotton, pin etc are required to do these experiments which are stored in specific yellow waste bins after when they are cast aside after use.
